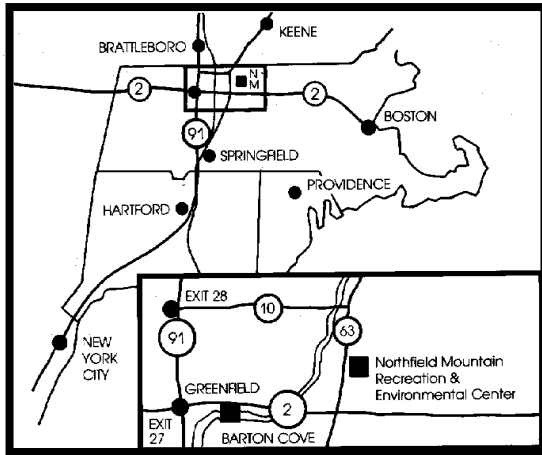


Northfield Mountain Recreation and Environmental Center

The Northfield Mountain Recreation and Environmental Center is part of the Northfield Mountain Pumped Hydroelectric Station located in Northfield, Massachusetts. This federally licensed plant provides the public with a variety of recreational opportunities through the Recreation and Environmental Center.

Provisions for outdoor recreation include: canoeing, kayaking, fishing, and tenting at Barton Cove; camping for boaters, kayakers, and canoeists only at Munns Ferry; and hiking, mountain biking and picnicking in the warm months—as well as winter cross country skiing, at the Northfield Mountain Visitor Center. The Visitor Center also features exhibits on Connecticut River history in the area, and a film documenting the creation of Northfield Mountain Station.

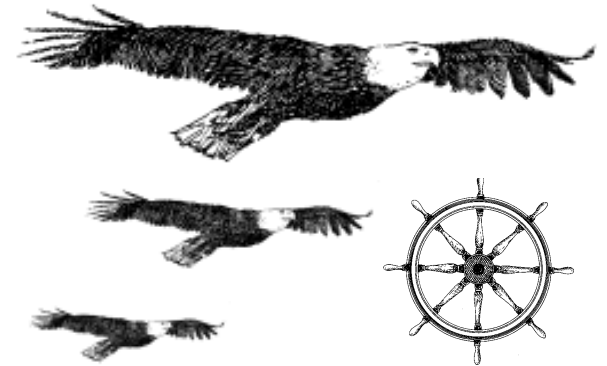
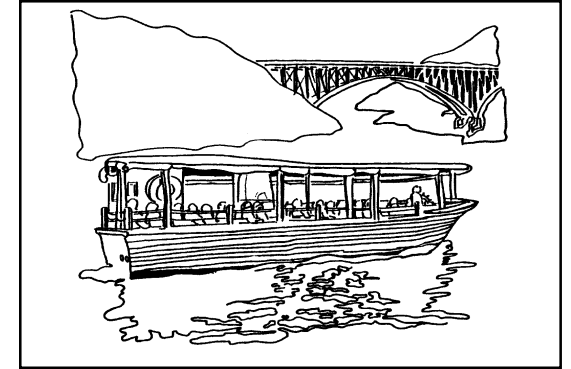

Step aboard the Quinnetukut II and experience the stunning French King Gorge and historic Barton Cove on a narrated, 1-½ hour cruise along the most beautiful stretch of the Connecticut River in the Bay State. Our interpreter will acquaint you with the fascinating geological and natural history of the river as you cruise through a landscape that had its beginnings over half a billion years ago. You'll learn of nesting bald eagles, migratory fish, log drivers, ice harvesters, mysterious "deep holes", and river barges— everything from prehistoric river-users, to the generation of electricity on the river.

Cruise Schedule

The Quinnetukut II operates Friday through Sunday. Some cruises may be reserved exclusively for charters or visiting school groups, *so be sure to call for reservations.* There are no cruises Mondays, Tuesdays or Wednesdays. Charters and group tours may be available on Thursdays by advance reservation.

Private Charters

The Quinnetukut II can serve as a unique location for weddings, reunions, company retreats and other special events. Chartered cruises carry up to sixty passengers and prices start at just \$375.
